IT'S Clean Up Australia Day's 20th anniversary this Sunday and residents are invited to help clean up Campbelltown.

Campbelltown Golf Club, Glen Alpine; Coronation Park, Minto and Rizal Park, Rosemeadow.

Schools will chip in on Friday with their Clean Up Day.

Campbelltown Public School students are also taking part in The Green Up Clean Up fund-raiser on the day.

"Campbelltown Public School is leading by example, choosing a healthy fund-raiser promoting awareness and the importance of our environment," said Sarah Morgan from The Fundraising Group.

The Green Up Clean Up program lets students do their bit for the environment and raises extra funds for schools to put back into their surrounding environment or spend on educational projects such as water tanks, vegetable gardens or native tree planting.
